BPO 2023-2024 REPORT: You will find a BPO Education and Community Final Report attached. High-lights include: 13,963 Buffalo Public School students being served; 7,659 Erie County School students being served; 2024 Student programs and workshop; 1,466 Disability Workshops; multiple engagements of 200 students between the Orchard Park Ellicott Elementary and the BPS International School #45; 400 students being serviced in Lancaster CSD through residencies; 269 High School students participating from 44 different high schools in the Symphony Hall Pass; and 316 teachers from 221 schools across WNY utilized Digital Resources. A president and vice president are elected, new board members are sworn in, and several people will take an oath of office. Following those procedures, there will be the approval of many businesses, policies, entities and people to different positions. Often a Board will hold their Re-organization meeting prior to their regular Board of Education meeting. Since many Boards of Education record their meetings and archive the meetings, a Board Member could always review the previous years Re-Organization meeting. Board Members will most likely be receiving the agenda for the Re-Organization meeting several days in advance, so they can review in detail the agenda and contact the Superintendent with any questions or concerns they may have.
