<u>SCHOOL BOARD MANDATED TRAINING</u>: I have had several inquiries lately regarding the Mandated Training for New School Board Members. If Board Members attend training at ECASB or NYSSBA they will obtain a certificate that should be turned into the District Clerk. The District Clerk should keep all certificates on file. A Board Member only needs to complete the mandated training once. So if a Board Member completes training, and then there is a lapse in service because they did not run for office and are then later back on the board, they would not need to complete another course of study in the mandated training. We not aware if the Comptrollers office has done any audits on school boards member taking their mandated training, however, I would recommend that District Clerks keep the certificate on file for all Board Members. Board Members failing to complete their mandated training within the first year of service are subject to removal by the Commissioner of Education.
