Senator Robert Ortt, Assemblyman Bill Conrad, Assemblyman Paul Bologna and Assemblyman Angelo Morinello were in attendance. Superintendents Mark Laurrie (Niagara Falls), Daniel Ljiljanich (Niagara Wheatfield) and Paul Casseri (Lewiston Porter) spoke about issues that they would like addressed which included Social and Emotional Health of Students, Zero Emission Buses, CVA's, School Safety, Increasing the Capital Outlay, Support for ELL, School Staffing and Civil Service, Support for Career and Technical Education, UPK, Special Education Costs and Foundation Aid.
