Dirk Rabenold has served on the Sweet Home CSD Board of Education for over 20 years. After a brief hiatus, Dirk was recently elected to serve on the Sweet Home CSD Board of Education. Dirk had been active for most of his years on the Sweet Home CSD Board of Education on the ECASB Legislative Committee - often meeting with legislators locally as well as in Albany and in Washington D.C. Looking at Legislative Minutes from when Dirk first became involved in School Boards, New York State was looking at a new Foundation Aid Formula. When Dirk Rabenold first served, Brian Higgins was a NYS Assemblyman, and Byron Brown was a New York State Senator. Thus, in some cases, things have changed a lot while others aspects of education have not changed much. The most important institutions today are our Public Schools. Dirk's interest in getting back on School Board stems from his philosophy that "An educated populace and community participation help to guide those schools. The role of the School Board should be to ensure resources are used efficiently and effectively to provide a quality education. Today, School Boards seem to have lost their way. They give more importance to the whims of the Board of Regents and Albany politicians rather than the education of our children. We need to work together to push back on these whims. Enough is enough."

Prior to serving on the School Board, Dirk worked with several parents, students and teachers to make Boys Ice hockey a school sponsored sport. For 3 years, he urged the Board of Education to put it on the ballot for a vote along with the annual budget. Eventually it was adopted. He was happy to support the Girls Ice Hockey that came a few years later.

Dirk served as a member of the Sweet Home School Board from July of 2000 and ended his first Board Career in June of 2020. Early on in his tenure with the Board, he worked alongside teachers and the community and was able
